is nominated where there is an
expiring term.
3. Being a cooperator of the dis-
trict, defined as, "a person who is
actively engaged in farming and
practices conservation activities
related to agriculture".
4. Being a current resident and
tax-paying citizen of the county
for at least two years preceding
the election date.
5. Be eighteen (18) years of age

LOOKING BACK

Last Witness to the Battle of
Hartville Laid to Rest

The remains of “Mammy” Anna Prater were interred
Thursday at the Love Ridge Farm Cemetery near Sey-
mour, bringing to a close the long and remarkable life
of a woman whose story spanned more than a century
of American history. Born April 14, 1805, in Darling-
ton, South Carolina, she lived to the extraordinary age
of 119 years.

Prater was born the daughter of Thomas Heyward
Jr., a signer of the Declaration of Independence, and a
slave named Mary Ann. As a small child, she was said
to have quietly watched from behind curtains as her
father met with Thomas Jefferson and Wilson Cary
Nicholas, bearing silent witness to the earliest days of
the young Republic.

In her early years, she worked for the Law family be-
fore being sold in 1838 to a family in Louisiana, and
later to John Hampden Randolph of Nottoway Planta-
tion. While there, she met Dr. Thomas Bradford, who
was sent to serve as the plantation physician. Assigned
to assist him during his visits, Prater learned many
medical skills under his instruction—knowledge that
would serve her and others throughout her life.

Her husband and children were later sold away into
slavery, and she never heard from them again. In the
midst of such sorrow, she remained steadfast in spirit
and faith.

In the early 1850s, she was sold to Thomas B. Love
of Missouri and taken to Love Ridge Farm, where she
remained until 1871. That year, her path again crossed
with Dr. Bradford, then residing in Marshfield, Mis-
souri. She joined the Bradford household, where she
became a trusted and beloved member of the fami-
ly. While living with the Bradfords, she was taught to
read and write—an uncommon privilege for a woman
of her condition and time.

In 1863, she witnessed the Battle of Hartville in
Hartville, Missouri. Years later, she survived the
Marshfield Cyclone of April 18, 1880, and helped
nurse Laura Bradford back to health. She also tended
to her niece, Maggie Elizabeth (Kibbe) Inman, until
Maggie succumbed to her injuries, afterward helping
to raise her orphaned son, Robert Todd Inman (Jef-
ferson Fyan Bradford Dockery), who would later rise
to the rank of Brigadier General.

In her later years, Prater moved to California for
health reasons, where she lived until her passing on
October 30, 1924. Her long life drew attention from
journalists and census workers alike, who document-
ed her story and remarkable longevity.

A private graveside service was officiated by Briga-
dier General Robert Todd Inman and attended by for-
mer Governor and Mrs. Alexander M. and Mildred
Forbes Dockery, Rose Wilder Lane, and members of
the Inman and Bradford families on November 27,
1924.
